Tim served as CEO of the non-profit Crossroad's Center Antigua, Eric Clapton's holistic addiction treatment program before joining Northern California's Bayside Marin as its Executive Director in 2008. He also was Clinical Director at The Camp Recovery Center. Tim sits on the Board of CAADAC, is its Past-President and current Dean of Fellows.
